ORDER REGARDING COURT OPERATIONS

In response to the COVID-19 pandemic and the Tennessee Supreme Court Order of May 14, 2021 Modifying Capacity, Distancing, and Facial Covering Requirements, the Farragut Municipal Court of the Sixth Judicial District enters the following order modifying the Court's previous Judicial District Plan approved on May 25, 2020. This order shall remain in effect until further order of the Court:

1. Court dates shall be scheduled at least two (2) times per calendar month. Court shall begin at 6:00 p.m. with all parties being cited to appear at 6:00 p.m. or later.
2. Individuals will no longer be required to wait outside the courtroom until instructed to enter by court personnel and will no longer be required to check in with the Court Bailiff for COVID-19 prescreening prior to entering the courtroom.
3. Social distancing requirements will be reduced from six feet (6') to three feet (3') in the courtroom and courtroom waiting areas and capacity restrictions for the courtroom will be lifted. The judge may limit the total number of individuals inside the courtroom at any time at his discretion.
4. Masks and facial coverings are optional but not mandatory.
5. The court reserves the right to hold hearings virtually using video via Cisco Webex software. All parties will be notified at least seven (7) days before the scheduled court hearing if the hearing will be conducted virtually.

This order shall remain in effect until further order from the Court.
