
ORDER LIFTING INTERIM SUSPENSION

This cause came on to be considered this date upon notice from Disciplinary Counsel that the indictment charging Amanda Sammons, Judge of the General Sessions Court of Campbell County, Tennessee with Official Misconduct, has been dismissed.

Tenn. Code Ann. §17-5-304(g) provides that upon the filing of an indictment charging a judge with a felony under the law of any state or under federal law, the Board of Judicial Conduct may immediately place the judge on interim suspension. The Board entered such an order on August 10, 2016. As there is now no pending indictment charging Judge Sammons with any crime, the interim suspension should now be lifted, and her judicial power and authority should therefore be restored.


