This investigative report was predicated upon an oral request by the Honorable Al Schmutzer Jr., DAG, Fourth Judicial Circuit.

Preliminary investigation revealed that on 02/28/92, a badly burned body, later identified as CONNIE BRANAM was located in the Clear Fork section of Wear's Valley in Sevier County. The body was in a burned automobile.

On 02/23/92, a crime scene search was conducted by Dr. Bill Bass, State Fire Marshall Gary Clabo, and members of the Sevier County Sheriff's Department. A spent .303 rifle cartridge was one of the items discovered in the vehicle.

Further investigation revealed that (V) BRANAM was last seen on 02/22/92, when she had left her residence to search for her brother who was missing. The body of her brother, (V) TOMMY GRIFFIN, was discovered on 02/24/92, near Walland, Tennessee, in Blount County, next to Little River. Cause of death of (V) GRIFFIN was determined to be from a 12 gauge shotgun wound to the back of the head. Two spent shotgun shell casings were found at the scene by Blount County Detectives.

(S) DELLINGER and SUTTON were with both victims when they were last seen alive. A rifle, spent .303 cartridge and spent shotgun shells were recovered at (S) DELLINGER'S residence. This weapon and shells matched shells recovered at both scenes.

JAMES CLEVE GRIFFIN was interviewed at his residence. After proper identification and explanation of the purpose for the interview, he voluntarily provided the following information:

JAMES GRIFFIN is the brother of (V) CONNIE BRANAM and (V) TOMMY GRIFFIN. He said he hadn't seen (V) CONNIE BRANAM for two or three days prior to her disappearance. He hadn't seen (V) TOMMY in approximately a week prior to his death. JAMES GRIFFIN said, (S) GARY SUTTON, used to date his sister (TAMMY). He said, two or three months ago his brother (BILLY got into a fight with (S) GARY SUTTON. (S) GARY SUTTON beat BILLY pretty bad. They had the fight at JAMES GRIFFIN'S house. BILLY took some warrants out for (S) SUTTON after the fight. (V) TOMMY GRIFFIN had a girl friend. Her name is (ROBIN BRANAM. JAMES GRIFFIN said, "She is at the house right now." He said, "JAMES DELLINGER has threatened me on occasions. I think that he is the one that shot my car up. He shot my car up a couple of months ago. CONNIE told me that they had been swimming where TOMMY was found. I think that JAMES DELLINGER and GARY SUTTON were probably the two people that killed my brother. We used to be pretty good friends with DELLINGER, but not anymore since the trouble started between him and BILLY."

On 02/24/92, (V) TOMMY GRIFFIN'S body was located in the Walland section, near Little River, in Blount County. Death was determined to have been from a 12 gauge shotgun wound to the back of the head. Blount County Detectives recovered two 12 gauge shotgun shells at the crime scene, also a beer can and some other items of evidence. There was also a 12 gauge wadding and .00 buckshot pellets recovered from the body. TBI was not contacted to assist in the crime scene. These items were taken by the detectives from the Blount County S.D. and submitted to the TBI Crime Lab.

Photographs of the scene were taken by Det. Widner and Det. Courley of the Blount County S.D. An autopsy was done at the request of the Blount County S.D.

On 02/28/92, a badly burned automobile, a 1970, Dodge Dart Swinger, brown in color, TN tag #VLT-105 was located by JAMES GORDON, who was staying in a house nearby. GORDON had seen a fire in the area on Saturday, 02/22/92, at approximately 8:30 PM, and had been curious and drove up into the area and discovered the burned car. The description of the car matched the description of the vehicle which was owned by (V) CONNIE BRANAM. MRS. BRANAM was last seen driving the vehicle on Saturday, 02/22/92.

Inside the vehicle in the front passenger side of the vehicle, appeared to be a badly burned body with very few remains (some intestines remaining). What appeared to be the head was in the steering wheel area. The pelvis was in the middle of the seat and the remnants of the legs were in the passenger seat.

The crime scene was secured by members of the Sevier County S.D. on 02/28/92. Dr. William Bass, Forensic Anthropologist from the University of Tennessee, was contacted and agreed to come to the scene on Saturday, 02/29/92. (See Forensic Report by Dr. Bass, Serial #6.)

On 02/29/92, this Agent, along with Sevier County Sheriff Don Ogle, Chief Deputy Mike VonCannon, State Fire Marshal Gary Clabo, Dr. Bill Bass, Murray Marks, from the Forensic Anthropology Dept. at U.T., and Sevier County Detectives, went back to the scene. Sevier County Detectives present at the scene were

While the scene was being processed Det. Jim Widner, of the Blount County S.D. arrived.

The interior of the vehicle was examined by Dr. Bass, Murray Marks and Arson Investigator Gary Clabo. Inside the car they discovered a fired 303 British In-field casing. When the shell was discovered Det. Widner said that Blount County authorities had taken a .303 rifle when they had served a search warrant at the JAMES DELLINGER residence on 02/28/92. A complete search of the area was made by members of the Sevier County S.D. The vehicle was removed by Mouse's Wrecker Service and towed to Sevierville.

Fire Marshal Clabo ruled that the car fire was arson. The remains were removed by Dr. Bass to the Forensic Anthropology facility at the University of Tennessee.

On Monday, 03/02/92, dental records were located by Chief VonCannon of the Sevier County S.D. They were transported by Sevier County Det. Donnie Huskey to Dr. Bass' office. As a result of comparing the dental records with the remains found in the car, the body was positively identified as being (V) CONNIE BRANAM. Also, Dr. Bass informed this Agent and Sevier Co. Sheriff Don Ogle that there appeared to be a gunshot wound to the left shoulder area of the victim.

The crime scene was video taped and photographed by Sevier Co. S.D. as well as Gary Clabo with the State Fire Marshal's Office, and photographs were taken by Dr. Bass.

On 02/29/92, a search warrant was served on (S) JAMES DELLINGER for a 1983 Dodge pickup truck, VIN #1B7FD14M8D5496466, white in color, which was owned by (S) DELLINGER. A copy of the search warrant is attached.

Items seized from the vehicle were photographed and are in the custody of Captain Larry McMahan, of the Sevier County S.D. Appropriate items will be sent to the TBI Crime Lab.

On 02/28/92, Blount County Detectives served a search warrant on the residence of (S) JAMES DELLINGER, located in the Gibson Hollow area of Sevier County. As a result of this search, fired 12 gauge shotgun shells were recovered and also a .303 rifle. These items remain in the custody of Blount County S.D. A copy of their warrant is attached.

All items of evidence recovered from the search warrants were transported to the TBI Crime Lab on 03/02/92, by the Blount County Evidence Technician and Capt. Larry Turner.

On 03/04/92, after obtaining a consent to search from (S) JAMES DELLINGER, members of the Sevier County S.D. went to (S) DELLINGER'S residence again and there located a spent .303 cartridge, similar to the one found in the burned automobile under the body of (V) CONNIE BRANAM. This shell was transported to the TBI Crime Lab by Capt. McMahan, as well as several other fired cartridges which were recovered by Sheriff Ogle in the

This investigation was predicated upon an oral request by the Hon. DAG Al Schmutzer, Jr., Fourth Judicial Circuit. Preliminary investigation revealed that on 02/22/92, (V) CONNIE BRANAM had left her residence, located at 2348 Bluff Heights Road, Sevierville, Tennessee, to search for her brother, (V) TOMMY GRIFFIN, who had not been seen since he had been released on bail, 02/21/92, from the Blount Co. Jail. (V) GRIFFIN had been put in jail for public drunkenness by the Alcoa Police Dept. When (V) GRIFFIN was last seen getting out of jail he was in the company of (S) JAMES DELLINGER and (S) GARY SUTTON. (S) JAMES DELLINGER posted (V) TOMMY GRIFFIN'S bond.

On Monday, 02/24/92, the body of (V) TOMMY GRIFFIN was found near Walland, Tennessee, in Blount County, near Little River. The cause of death was determined to have been a shotgun wound to the back of the head. Two spent shotgun shells were found by Blount County authorities during their crime scene search.

On Friday, 02/28/92, the body of (V) CONNIE BRANAM was found burned in her vehicle, a 1970 Dodge Swinger, brown in color, TN license VLF-105. The vehicle was found in the Clear Fork section of Happy Hollow in Sevier County.

On 02/29/92, the vehicle was processed for possible evidence by State Fire Marshal Gary Clabo, Forensic Anthropologist Dr. Bill Bass, Anthropologist Murray Marks, Sevier County S.D., and this Agent. During the search of the victim's vehicle, in the pas-

During his examination of the victim, Dr. Bass determined she had been shot in the area of the left shoulder. Dr. Bass' opinion is the wound lead fragments are consistent with the rifle and not a shotgun.

On Friday, 02/21/92, Det. Jim Widner, of the Blount Co. S.D., executed a search warrant on the residence of (S) JAMES DELLINGER in Sevier County. As a part of that search a .303 rifle was seized by Det. Widner.

On 03/03/92, (S) JAMES DELLINGER gave a written and verbal consent to Sevier Co. Deputies to again search his premises. As part of this search one spent .303 rifle cartridge was located at the residence by Det. Jeff McCarter. Investigation by Sheriff Don Ogle, Sevier Co. Detectives, and this Agent, ascertained the following:

(S) JAMES DELLINGER owned a .303 rifle and had shot it in Sevier and Blount County.

On Saturday, 02/22/92, (S) JAMES DELLINGER and (S) GARY SUTTON were identified meeting (V) CONNIE BRANAM at the Townsend Shopping Center in Townsend, Tennessee, by JERRY SULLIVAN. SULLIVAN owns the Townsend Shopping Center. This was at approximately 2:00 PM. (V) CONNIE BRANAM left her vehicle parked at the Townsend Shopping Center and was seen by JERRY SULLIVAN getting into a white Dodge pickup truck with a tool box on the back with two W/M, in the truck.

(V) CONNIE BRANAM, (S) JAMES DELLINGER, and (S) GARY SUTTON were identified by several customers and employees of HOWIE'S HIDEAWAY LOUNGE, which is located on Highway 321, between Maryville, and Townsend, as being at the bar. (S) DELLINGER, (S) SUTTON, and the victim were at the lounge from approximately 2:30 PM, to 7:00 PM, when they left.

At approximately 8:30 PM, 02/22/92, JAMES GORDON saw a fire where the victim's automobile and body were discovered (GORDON discovered the body).

At approximately 9:00 PM, 02/22/92, BOYD BRANAM (the victim's husband) saw a white Dodge pickup truck, he identified as being (S) JAMES DELLINGER'S truck with two people in it entering Gibson Hollow going towards (S) DELLINGER'S residence.

(S) JAMES DELLINGER and (S) GARY SUTTON were interviewed by Det. Widner and Gourley, from the Blount Co. S.D., first denied seeing (V) CONNIE BRANAM on 02/22/92, in a subsequent interview, they admitted seeing (V) BRANAM in Townsend, and being with her at the bar in Blount County, on 02/22/92.

The rifle that was seized by Blount County authorities, and the .303 shell found by Jeff McCarter, was sent to the TBI Crime Lab. Firearms experts positively identified the shell being found in the victim's car as being fired from the .303 rifle owned and seized at (S) JAMES DELLINGER'S residence. The spent .303 cartridge that was found by Jeff McCarter at (S) JAMES DELLINGER'S residence was compared spent .303 cartridge, which was found in the victim's vehicle. TBI experts determined both .303 shells had been fired from the same weapon. Subsequent comparisons were made of shotgun shells which were found at (S) DELLINGER'S residence by Blount Co. Detectives, and two shotgun shells that were found at the residence were determined to match the two shotgun shells that were found at the scene where (V) TOMMY GRIFFIN was found murdered in Walland.

(V) CONNIE BRANAM and (V) TOMMY GRIFFIN are brother and sister and lived next door to each other.

It should also be noted that on the night (V) TOMMY GRIFFIN disappeared from the Blount County Jail, his trailer burned to the ground. State Fire Marshal Gary Clabo determined that the fire was arson.

Subsequent interviews of the neighborhood indicated that a white pickup truck similar to the one being driven by (S) DELLINGER and (S) SUTTON was seen in front of (V) GRIFFIN'S trailer shortly before the fire started and a W/M was seen running from the trailer. The neighbor also watched the truck leave the (V) GRIFFIN trailer and drive to the (S) DELLINGER residence and park in the driveway.

(V) CONNIE BRANAM'S automobile was burned. The body was burned beyond recognition. It was identified by Forensic Anthropologist Dr. Bass and his Assistants through dental x-rays which were located at Dr. Pope's and Dr. Madison's office, both in Sevierville, Tennessee, by Sevier Co. Det. Donnie Huskey and Chief Mike VonCannon.

On 03/05/92, a special session of the Sevier Co. Grand Jury was called. As a result of the Grand Jury action (S) DELLINGER and (S) SUTTON were indicted for 1st Degree Murder and Aggravated Arson. This Agent, Sheriff Ogle, Chief VonCannon, SA David Griswold, Inv. David Hutchison, and Sevier Co. Detectives, went to (S) DELLINGER'S residence located in Seymour, Tennessee. (S) DELLINGER and (S) SUTTON were both at the residence. They were

removed without incident and transported to the Sevier County Jail. They were arraigned by Circuit Judge William Holt and were ordered held without bond in the Sevier Co. Jail.

Investigation is continuing in Blount County, in an attempt to indict (S) DELLINGER and (S) SUTTON in the death of (V) TOMMY GRIFFIN. It is planned by Blount County Detectives to present the case at an April session of the Blount County Grand Jury.

Investigation is continuing by TBI, Sevier Co. S.D., the State Fire Marshal's Office and Blount Co. S.D.
