**CONCURRING OPINION**

I concur with the majority's decision that Ms. King is entitled to \$13,600 in damages stemming from her employer's delay in providing her a hearing before the chairperson of the Private Industry Council. I also concur that Ms. King did not submit satisfactory evidence of her civil service status even though certain employees of the Mayor's Employment and Training Resources Agency ("METRA") might be entitled to civil service protection because METRA is a federal grant-in-aid agency.
