ORDER

Upon consideration of the application for permission to appeal of the State of Tennessee and the record before us, the application is granted. In light of this Court's decision in <u>State v. DeBerry</u>, No. W2019-01666-SC-R11-CD, issued on August 30, 2022, the judgment of the Court of Criminal Appeals as to Count One of the indictment for driving as a motor vehicle habitual offender is reversed. It is further ordered that the trial court's original judgment as to the defendant's conviction for driving as a motor vehicle habitual offender should be reinstated. All other portions of the Court of Criminal Appeals' opinion are affirmed.

Because it appears that the defendant is indigent, the costs of the appeal are taxed to the State of Tennessee.
