## ORDER AMENDING RULE 8 OF THE RULES OF THE COURT OF THE JUDICIARY

At the statutory semiannual meeting of the Court of the Judiciary on February 28, 2001, more than a quorum of the Judges of the Court being present, the amendment of Rule 8 of the Rules of the Court of the Judiciary which was adopted by the Court on June 28, 2000, was again discussed. On motion to rescind the amendment duly made and seconded, the Judges of the Court unanimously voted to rescind the amendment to Rule 8 previously adopted on June 28, 2000, returning Rule 8 to its form and wording prior to the amendment.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED, ADJUDGED and DECREED by the Court that the amendment to Rule 8 of the Rules of the Court of the Judiciary adopted on June 28, 2000 is rescinded and Rule 8 is returned to its form and wording prior to the amendment, to wit:

**Confidentiality.** Except for hearings conducted pursuant to Tenn. Code Ann. § 17-5-308 or sanctions required to be public, matters that come before the Court are confidential. Individual members of the Court will not discuss any matter pending before the Court, except with other members of the Court and with Disciplinary Counsel.
